

CDAC OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMME (COPE)

➤ For Students

◆ CDAC Tuition Students

If the sole breadwinner of the family is retrenched or suffered pay cut, students can apply for tuition fees waiver.

◆ Students attending tuition at selected RCs and Community Clubs/Centres

Student whose monthly household income is not exceeding \$2,500 or monthly per capita income is not exceeding \$650 can apply for tuition fee subsidy up to 90%.

(The details of the subsidy scheme will be announced at a later date)

◆ Members of CDAC Student Service Centres or CDAC@Bukit Panjang

Student whose monthly household income is not exceeding \$2,500 or monthly per capita income is not exceeding \$650 can apply for course/programme fees subsidy up to 75%.

- ◆ Students studying in Primary/Secondary School, Institute of Technical Education, Junior College or Centralised Institute

To provide more CDAC-SFCCA Bursary which aims to help needy students to continue their formal education.

➤ For Workers

- ◆ Skill Training

Participants pay only 5% of the course fees, down from 25%.

- ◆ Career Readiness Certification (CRC)

Award holders who manage to attain Career Readiness Certification (CRC) can apply for an achievement incentive of up to \$400.

- ◆ SPUR@CDAC

SPUR@CDAC participants pay only half the net course fee, CDAC to co-fund up to a maximum of \$500.

- ◆ Job Securement Incentive

Unemployed SPUR@CDAC trainee who manages to secure a job while undergoing training or after attaining SPUR Certification(s) will be given an Ezlink card (worth \$25) as an incentive.

- For Seniors

- ◆ Help find employment for seniors to work full-time, part-time or flexi-time within local community.

- ◆ Equip seniors with employability skills.

- For Youth

- ◆ Provide 3 to 6 months of internships to the first-time job seekers as young school leavers. A monthly grant of \$500 will be given.

➤ For Families

- ◆ Single-parent, low-income or dysfunctional families

The duration of Workfare assistance schemes will be extended from 12 months to 18 months. Adopting a family-centric approach, Workfare Programme aims to help families to become self-reliant through adequate employment.

- ◆ Families facing short-term hardship

More families will be helped under CDAC-SFCCA Hardship Assistance Scheme.

- ◆ Family education to strengthen resilience

To strengthen family resilience by enhancing parenting and budgeting skills through the CDAC Parents

Development Programme.
